Prospective Students

The program is designed for all church leaders, Sunday School teachers, small group leaders, lay ministry leaders, and other persons interested in advancing their knowledge of the Bible and skill in presenting it. Students must be at least 21 years old.

Cost

The cost is greatly reduced to provide the equivalency of a Bible College training at an affordable price. Each 3-hour course is \$300. Audited classes do not include tests or assignments and cost \$100 each. Additional costs include registration fees, and course materials.

Available Semesters

The semesters will coincide with the academic semesters at Gateway Seminary. In addition to the Fall and Spring semesters two additional time periods may be available with very abbreviated lengths. The J Semester is about one month long, primarily in the month of January. The Summer semester is also short.

Auditing Courses

Students may audit courses. However, no credits will be earned. A \$100 fee will still be required. Availability to participate in the courses will depend on the available, remaining seating in the room.

Statement on Accreditation

ADVANCE is not a regionally or ATS accredited program. Gateway Seminary professors have provided course descriptions, learning objectives, and example syllabi. Course content is supervised by the ADVANCE National Office to ensure high standards. However, classes are post high school, not Master's level. The ADVANCE distinctive is its accessibility in terms of location, cost, and adaptability to a variety of local contexts.

GATEWAY SEMINARY

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1. Choose Your Ministry Focus

Within time the O.N.E. School could be equipped to offer training for the following thirteen Leadership Diplomas.

• Chaplaincy	• OnMission
• Children's Ministry	• Pastoral Ministry
• Christian Ministry	• Peer Counseling
• Church Education	• Preaching
• Church Planting	• Transformational Teaching
• Discipleship	• Women's Ministry
• Music Ministry	

For now the O.N.E. School will begin its first semester with a ministry focus in three areas: Christian Ministry, Introduction to Christian Studies, and Transformational (Bible) Teaching. Two of the three courses being offered the first semester are requirements for most of the thirteen leadership programs and can be credited towards those as they are added to our curriculum.

2. Choose Your Degree Program

Eventually we will offer all three levels of education for select programs: ministry certificates, ministry diplomas, and ministry leadership diplomas.

- Ministry Certificates are comprised of 12 hours of coursework focused on a particular area of ministry.
- Ministry Diplomas are comprised of the 12 hours necessary for a Ministry Certificate, plus 12 hours of introductory biblical study courses.
- Ministry Leadership Diplomas are comprised of 12 hours necessary for a Ministry Certificate, 12 hours for a Christian Leadership Certificate, and 24 hours of introductory and intermediate biblical study courses.

3. Complete the Required Courses

Consider for example the Discipleship Certificate. This includes the following courses, each one with three hours credit for a total of twelve hours.

Foundations of Ministry	3
Basic Evangelism	3
Working with Small Groups	3
Making Disciples	3
Total	12

Note: The certificate for Christian Ministry has no specialty emphasis. This certificate requires the completion of any four, 3-hour courses for a total of twelve hours.

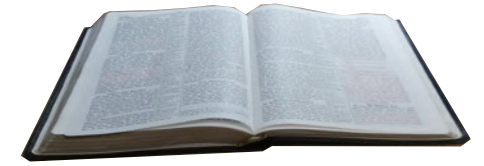

Course	Basic Evangelism	Introduction to Christian Theology	Making Disciples

Description	A study of evangelism, including the biblical basis, historical methods, practical application, and principles for building an evangelistic church. The class lays a foundation for effectively sharing the gospel anywhere. Class participants will gain the knowledge and tools to witness effectively and gain "hands on" experience by becoming involved in already existing outreaches and will be trained to follow-up with the new believers.	An introduction to Christian theology, surveying the doctrines of the person and works of Jesus Christ, the person and works of the Holy Spirit, Salvation, the Church, and Last Things (End Times) Eschatology. We will have an additional focus on the ethical implications of Christian thought and practice. This class will be both thoughtful and practical. We will work together to know these doctrines better and to live out their truth in our daily lives.	This course explores the process of spiritual development as well as methods of discipleship practice in the church. Students will examine the biblical backgrounds of discipleship and the role of spiritual disciplines, accountability in spiritual growth, and community. The best way to grow any ministry is to make disciples and work yourself out of a job. This course will also apply disciple-making on a personal basis, and develop a long-range plan for the local church in cooperation with church leadership.
Course Credit	This course is a requirement for the Discipleship Certificate. This also qualifies for the Christian Ministry Certificate.	This course is a requirement for the Introduction to Christian Studies certificate program and for all diploma programs.	This course is a requirement for twelve of the certificate programs and their corresponding diploma programs.
